New Life

What are images of new life and resurrection that you see around you? Have you come across blooming flowers this Spring? Have you seen and heard new life with migrating birds and wildlife coming out again after hibernating? I know I am looking forward to planting my raised beds with some seeds I started inside on a heating mat and under some grow lights. I had gotten a little anxious and probably started everything too early with all the late snow and cold weather we have had in April. Anxiety is normal as we wait the Saturday before Easter; for new life after the Good Friday’s in our life. Waiting for the new life of Easter is not comfortable or easy. Yet, we do know and see that Spring does eventually come and begins to undo all the gains that Winter had made. There are many signs in nature of the dying back and rising up again that brings hope and shows us resurrection life.

Another image of resurrection I came across recently was this poem, “Pretty Ugly” where you read line by line, top to bottom like we usually approach text. Then at the bottom you see a note that says, “Now read bottom up.” The meaning we hear as we read line by line in the other direction maybe isn’t surprisingly an opposite meaning. Reading in this way undoes the thoughts presented when initially read from the top down. Experiencing this was lovely for me as I realized words often heard in our world kill and bring death. If only it were as easy as reading them the other way in order to raise up and bring life. However, I do see this as a reminder of what happens as we gather as church and the power God’s Word has when spoken to our souls. The power to undo the hold that sin and death claims to have on us are undone through Jesus. We are not powerless as we look to Jesus who, like this poem reminds us to be open to see and hear things in a new way. What God has to say to us in love often turns our world upside down in the best way possible.



COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Apr. 13, 2022
Unapproved Minutes

Jerome called the meeting to order.

Present: Jerome Crandall, Broc Lietz, Todd Erickson, Derek Flanagan, Stacy Link, Melissa Grommesh, Pastor Jacobson, Pastor Walka, Joan Carvell

Opening devotions were led by Pastor Mike.

Secretary Report- The March minutes had been emailed to the council. Broc made a motion to approve the minutes. Todd seconded; motion passed.

Financial Report- Broc went through the March Financial statements. Todd made a motion to accept the financial reports, Melissa seconded, motion passed. April's bills were presented. An invoice arrived after sending the bills to the council. Jerry's Excavating sent a bill for \$5,000.00 that dates to October of 2020. We were not aware of this billing, so it had not been accounted for in the budget. Derek felt due to Jerry Sr's generosity in the past years regarding free snow removal; he feels we should pay the full bill but thinks we should have a conversation with Jerry Sr. Todd made a motion to approve all the bills as presented. Derek seconded; motion passed.

Committee Reports

Worship/Media- Derek did not have a lot to report. We are trying to find the cause of the streaming problem. The number of views is down by people. Broc asked if we should stop the live streaming until we have a solution. We could still post the videos after the service. Midco has service tickets open for this issue and are monitoring our worship services as we live stream. Derek suggested to stay the course so that we can

continue to trouble shoot the service. A message will go out to let people know there may issues while watching the live worship but that the full video will be published afterwards.

Education-Stacy said May 1st will be the last day of Sunday school. Men of Martin's will be cooking a meal that day. It will also be the VBS kick-off. June 6-9 will be VBS. American Under Dog will be the movie for the Youth Group Activity, along with supper and concession food snacks on April 20th. 7th-12th grade is welcome but will be split up.

Property-Todd talked to Jeff Haugen about the bell tower. He wants to make it but has been busy with work. Todd went up onto the roof to clear the ice jams because there was a leak into the women's bathroom and classrooms. There was a suggestion to get a quote from Gateway on more ice breakers and suggestion on how to prevent ice jams.

Social Outreach and Ministry-Monica not present.

Fellowship and Support Committee-Melissa needs a decision on the summer worship schedule, so they know if they need monthly coordinators. She asked if the scholarship applications went out. Joan said when the senior letters were mailed the seniors were asked to email a request for the form so that the forms could be completed on the computers for easier reading.

Old Business

Summer Worship Time- Broc mentioned this at Men of Martin's. The general feeling was Sunday morning or an evening service during the week. Stacy heard the same thing or 2 Sundays mornings of the month and two weekday evenings during the month. Derek did not hear the suggestion of weekday evenings from people. Stacy made the motion to continue 9:30am Sunday morning worship service. Broc seconded the motion. Motion passed.

New Business

Bids for HVAC System routine maintenance- tabled until the second bid is received.

Internet Service Provider- Broc suggested to ask Midco for a decreased bill for the missed internet service during our down times. The council also would like to ask DRN if they would turn on the service so we can test if they have the same problem as Midco or if the problem is on our side.

Pastor's Report and Remarks:

Pastor Keith- 8 youth are going to Lutherock, and he and Kayla Anderson will be the adult leaders. He officiated a wedding. The Sr. Olympics were completed, there has been 5 Baptisms in the last month, and he attended a Fargo Conference on Lutheran Immigration re-location service. A VBS Planning meeting has taken place, Stacy says she will be stepping away from VBS this summer. We had the First Communion classes, a funeral, and attended the Ecumenical Lent services. It will be a busy week with Lent services. He will be attending the Red Willow clean-up day and will stay for their annual meeting. He scheduled continuing education in the cities the beginning of May. There will be a caramel roll fundraiser Mother's Day, Josiah Crandall's Eagle Scout ceremony April 25th, and Martin's Youth will be serving food at Totally Tables April 22nd.

Pastor Mike- asked the suggested people to be on the scholarship committee and they all agreed. The high school seniors have been given the information about applying for the scholarship. He has had in office conversations with people, one member will be having an extensive back surgery and the handicap button for the door has been fixed. We held Kyle Giermann's ordination last month. Pastor Mike shared correspondence and gave a health update.
