



# COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

#### February 2024

These notes are from the most recent Council Meeting held on February 7. When approved by the Council at their next meeting in March, the approved minutes will be posted in the Council Minutes Binder in the Conference Room.

#### February meeting notes:

The meeting was called to order by President Stacy Link. Minutes of the January meeting were approved. Discussion on the finances through the first month of the fiscal year was led by Treasurer Derek Flanagan. The report was approved as well as the February bills that were paid including a bill for the special cake to celebrate the paying off of Martin's mortgage!

Committee reports included the Fellowship and Support Committee with an update on the new service groups which are working better each month as we work through our new cycle. Also, Property will be gathering information and a smaller group of people to visit with Jeff Haugen about design ideas for installation of Martin's bell on the new church campus.

The Call Committee was in attendance and Chair Scott Kost reported that the primary candidate under consideration for Senior Pastor continues to be interested in Martin's. Each member of the Call Committee shared their opinions of the pastoral candidate with the Council. They then said they were in unanimous support of calling the candidate. After hearing their comments, the Council moved and seconded that the named candidate for Senior Pastor be presented to the congregation at a Special Meeting of the congregation on Sunday, February 25 following worship. Required notices will be sent to Martin's members.

## **Pastors Thoughts**

#### March 2024

It was about a year ago that I looked out my office window and could not see the outdoor furniture of Martin's Prayer Garden nor the homes blocked by the nearly two story high snow plowed hills of our parking lot. Aah the changes of weather! Last winter we had about 20 days of closed highways due to snow and wind and this winter I'm still brushing off the collected dust on the snow blower!

Changes. We all go through changes. In the almost year and a half that I have served as your pastor there have been many changes in our Martin's community. New faces, new families, Baptisms, deaths of loved ones, people moving, ...just to name a few. Soon I will be ending my interim pastorate at Martin's and you will welcome and celebrate a new Senior Pastor and his family arriving in your midst. Exciting change!

Change comes in different ways. In my own family we have had change that was anticipated as our daughter and both sons made career changes. Younger grandchildren began new schools. MARCH 6<sup>TH</sup> Lord's Prayer Petitions 6-7, Doxology MARCH 20<sup>TH</sup> Sacrament of Baptism MARCH 27<sup>TH</sup> Sacrament of Communion

Be reminded of who Martin Luther was as we read some of his writings. Notice his concerns some of which are the same today and some we may see differently 500 years later. His desire was to meet the needs of people and churches to have God's Word and teaching on the basics of faith accessible for everyone. Come, bring a friend or neighbor and think deeply on these teachings of faith. Here are

## **A Willing Spirit**

This Lent as we connect with the stories in Acts and the movement of the Holy Spirit that Jesus promised us, I think I noticed something. There is a willingness of the Holy Spirit to lead the early church, and our church today, into something new and emerging. We may love times of worship that are familiar or traditional and the Spirit may move in us to create faith in these times. I also think the Spirit is willing to lead us in new ways that may not result in "perfect" worship because they are new and different but are still times of fruitful worship that creates faith. During this first week of Lent, hearing the Pentecost story I felt the Spirit draw us into precious moments of worship rather than perhaps perfect inerrant worship. Our hearts were prayerfully singing, "Come, Lord Jesus, come."


I hear these echoes in Psalm 51 with the words of a clean heart and a "right" spirit. I don't think this references a right or wrong spirit in terms of perfection, but rather a willing, open, obedient spirit to God's will which we pray for in the Lord's Prayer, to be done on earth as it is in heaven. God accomplishes this without us and without our prayer yet it is for our sake and therefore we are praying for God's will to be



accomplished in us and through us. Our willing spirit makes a difference in responding to the Holy Spirit and being open to God's will. I'm grateful for the willingness of so many of our members, young and old.

Here's a section of what Martin Luther explains about the Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer in the Large Catechism, "Observe that in these first three petitions we have needs that concern God himself in a very simple form, and yet everything has been for our sake. What we pray for concerns only ourselves in that, as mentioned above, we ask that what otherwise must be done without us may also be done in us. Just as God's name must be hallowed and his kingdom must come even without our prayer, so must his will be done and prevail even though the devil and all his host bluster, storm, and rage furiously against it in their fury, so that they may accomplish nothing and we may remain steadfast against all violence and persecution and submit to the will of God."

After many phone calls to update our membership information, we have started a new process for our monthly service groups. In the past a member of your group called you to either serve at fellowship hour or bring cookies and if they filled the needs, you were not called. This process left many members not having a way to serve the church and many felt as if they were never called. Now the service groups will be in charge of filling the many areas that are needed EVERY week at Martins. It takes between 20-25 people most Sundays, not counting

It takes between 20-25 people most Sundays, not counting musicians, pastors, offering counters, and sound people, to make each service run smoothly.

We are also adding a Service group "Fellowship Social" the month before your actual service month so each member can meet their group members, put a name to a face, and initial signups can be done. During this time, we will run through what is expected for each job and questions can be answered at that time. After that meeting those who were not able to attend will be called to fill in empty areas. The group, the service coordinator and I will meet after church on the FIRST SUNDAY of the month. We hope this process will help eliminate the last-minute weekly needs of the church. Together we can make Martins a strong, faithful, serving community.


